has area  $A = \pi ab$ . I compute the area of the ellipse using measurements a = 10 cm and b = 5 cm for its axes. However, I am only confident of each of my measurements up to  $\pm 1$  mm error. Use differentials to estimate the maximal possible error in the computed area.
